CCCF Site Rules

1. Units must be pitched in the positions indicated by the Rally Organiser or Marshal. The minimum distance between the facing walls of tents, caravans and awnings is 6 metres (20 feet).

2. At rally sites a filled bucket of water, in case of fire, must be kept at the front or tow hitch of the unit at all times. A unit owner must ensure the pitch is kept neat during a rally and is left clean and tidy.

3. Members must ensure their pitch is not overcrowded. This normally means a maximum of 6 persons and not more than two small 'pup' tents.

4. Ideally each unit should have its own sanitary equipment, comprising a chemical toilet and suitable approved sanitary fluid. The contents of chemical toilets must only be discharged at a recognised disposal point.

5. A receptacle must be used for waste water and not allowed to overflow.

6. Personal washing, the charging of chemical toilets and the cleansing of waste water containers must not take place at the drinking water taps.

7. All rubbish must be taken from the site for proper disposal elsewhere unless receptacles are provided.

8. All pets must be kept under close control, and not allowed to roam. Dogs must be on leads at all times, and leads must not exceed 3m (10 feet). Any fouling of the site shall be cleared immediately by the animal's owner. Dogs, except assistance dogs, should not be brought into meetings or any communal place where food is being prepared, or consumed, except in the open air.

9. The speed limit on all sites is 5 mph and only holders of a valid driving licence are allowed to drive vehicles on site. Provisional licence holders must be accompanied by an established full licence holder at all times, except solo motor cycles that can only be ridden directly to and from their pitch.

10. All drivers and any vehicle taken on to a rally site must be fully insured.

11. It is strongly recommended that each unit should carry a First-Aid kit and a Fire Extinguisher approved to BSI and/or FOC standards.

12. Members may only use small portable generators provided they are fitted with proper silencers and are only used between 0900 hours and 2100 hours. They will cease to operate them if so requested by the Rally Organiser or his agent. NOTE: This rule does not apply to generators being used for organised CCCF activities.

13. The Rally Organiser must be consulted before barbeques are lit. Barbeque stoves must not be used in a manner that will damage the turf. Always leave a safe distance between camping canvas and the stove. Barbecues should never be left unattended or used inside tents or awnings. Hot embers should not be left in tents or awnings due to the dangers of carbon monoxide poisoning.

14. Members may reserve pitches for their friends but only at the discretion of the Rally Marshal and any policy which may apply to that particular rally.

15. A Rally Organiser has authority to take action, in accordance with Standing Orders, against members or their guests whose actions may affect the good reputation of CCCF, cause offence, or affect the comfort or convenience of others.
